Resident Highlight

John D. and Sue Dorchester



John was born in Oklahoma City in 1935. His father was a Big Band Leader who turned down a Hollywood career and joined the military.

During WWII John moved 27 times following his father's military assignments. While living in Virginia John attended school and worked with wounded soldiers who were returning from European battles and German POWs, learning a bit of the German language.

After WWII he had several short term moves. He had an opportunity to meet General Dwight Eisenhower and Colonel William Westmoreland. He turned down a professional baseball offer, going to college instead. In 1953 John started his military journey in the Army ROTC and was part of the military community until December of 1968.

During his service years, among many other duties, he trained soldiers in combat techniques and tactics, transferred to Germany and served in the Allied Sectors including Berlin, and observed the build-up prior to the announcement and construction of the Berlin Wall.

John worked nationally and internationally as a consultant in various specialized fields serving both government and non-government agencies on a world-wide basis.

RV LIFE

According to Don, "Sue came from a family that considered 'camping' staying late at a neighbor's evening party. From my Ranger background, camping was finding a scardie hole to nap in. So, it was a major move for both of us when we purchased our first real RV in 1992."

During a business trip to Las Vegas they bought their Country Coach. Short story: Dorchesters arrive Las Vegas — Portland vehicle dealer arrives Las Vegas in new Country Coach — Dorchesters and dealer meet — Dorchesters drive away in Country Coach and dealer has new camper. Moral: real love for camping is a true love — when it bites, it bites.

The Dorchesters have an amazing life story, one that requires more than this small article to give it the attention it deserves.

They have been actively involved with the military, they have worked in businesses allowing them access to people most of us only hear about, conducted various special assignments for the United States in the U.S. and abroad, they have traveled as campers and met the "most wonderful people on the planet" and they have faced challenges head on.

They are survivors. In 2016 John received a diagnosis of 41 metastasizing melanoma tumors, with at least 10 in the brain. The original diagnosis projected as little as three weeks to three months to live. He was one of the last participants accepted in a cancer research program and one year after starting his treatments his cancer was in remission. Sue has been to the Mayo Clinic as an out-patient over the same amount of time.

Because of their subsequent physical limitations, they are not able to participate in the Mesa Spirit activities as they would like, or even spend time indoors with small crowds — but even so, they are grateful for the wonderful friends made here and are appreciative of Mesa Spirit's efforts on their behalf.

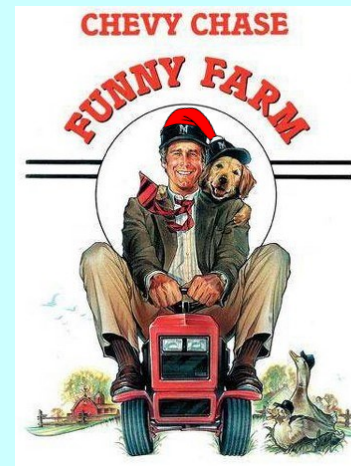

What can I put in the recycling containers here in Mesa Spirit?

First of all, the NEWSPAPER boxes found near the shuffleboard courts, Unit 1, near the pool on R Street and near the laundry on I Street welcome CLEAN newspaper (of course!), corrugated cardboard, cereal box type cardboard, magazines, junk mail and even old books.

Secondly, there are two large recycling containers on V street in the Northeast corner of the park. The one labeled "Cardboard Only" should be clear enough. Just make sure it's CLEAN. Greasy pizza boxes are NOT recyclable.

In the Commingled container these items still are marketable: cardboard, paper, tin cans, plastic drink bottles (especially all those single use water and soda bottles), aluminum cans and glass bottles and jars, CLEAN, of course. No garbage naturally and nothing not on this list. When in doubt, throw it out. If the wrong things are put in they will be sorted out and put in the trash at a Materials Recycling Facility in Tucson. No doubt they would appreciate it if we didn't put them to the effort of having to take out stuff that should really have gone in the trash in the first place.

Recycling was a great idea. Unfortunately relying on humans to do it properly doomed much of the experiment to failure. As is often the case it only took a few people to ruin recycling for those of us who seriously tried to make it work. China, for example, used to take our recyclables and manufacture things out of them, but got tired of dealing with our garbage. No markets, no recycling.

MESA SPIRIT RULES AND REGULATIONS HIGHLIGHT

RESORT ID BADGES: Each Home Owner, resident, or guest must obtain a Resort ID Badge. If you have not received your ID Badge, please visit the Business Office for more details. The ID Badge is to be carried at all times and will allow you to take advantage of Mesa Spirit's amenities while you are here. Just because you have acquired a badge does not mean you have been approved for Residency in the Resort.

PARKING: Residents shall observe posted parking signs and all other parking instructions from Management. Overnight parking of vehicles on the street is prohibited. Parking of vehicles on unoccupied sites is prohibited or sites for which residents do not have permission. Failure to follow these rules may result in your being charged the daily space rate for the unoccupied site, or your car being towed at your own expense, and/or a termination notice. **The Tow Company we use is All City Towing and their phone number is (480) 255-2489.**

If you have a vehicle that will not fit within your designated parking area, please speak with the Business Office for instructions regarding extra parking. **It is not the Resorts responsibility to accommodate extra parking, there are a limited number of spaces available. Should the resort run out of extra parking or storage sites, you may need to find a storage facility. The cost for Extra Parking and Storage is currently \$100.00 per month but is subject to increase at the Resort's discretion. The rate will not be prorated for a shorter term of use.**

To clarify a question the Activities Office has often been asked: **Who can participate in our activities and amenities?**

For the purpose of activities/clubs/amenities, if you have paid to live in Mesa Spirit, whether it be for a day, a week, a year, etc, you can participate in activities during the time you have paid for. This means you can buy event tickets at the resident price (must have your Mesa Spirit badge), attend our free events such as happy hour, and participate in activities/clubs, with certain requirements for some areas/clubs. You must wear your Mesa Spirit name badge for participation in the activities.

Free events are for residents only. Events where there is a purchase price (such as dances) are open to the public at a non-resident price.

Residents can purchase a "day pass" at the main office for a guest to use Mesa Spirit amenities. The resident must remain with the guest while guest is using the amenity.

Hopefully, this clears up some of the confusion. We appreciate our residents and want to help ensure you have a great time!

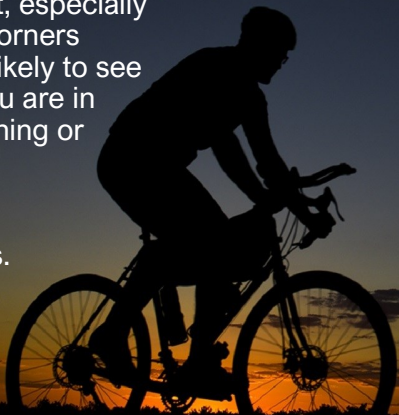
